

*Malus 'Spring Snow' dwarf* (Zone 4)  
**Dwarf Spring Snow Crab**



**Height:** 12'-16' • **Spread:** 11'-14' • **Shape:** Dense, oval  
**Foliage:** Medium green • **Flowers:** White, fragrant • **Fruit:** None

**Metasequoia** (Dawn Redwood)

*Metasequoia glyptostroboides* (Zone 5-8)  
**Dawn Redwood**

This deciduous conifer has a pyramidal to conical growth habit. Resembles true Redwood.



**Height:** 70'-100' • **Spread:** 25-40' • **Shape:** Narrow, conical  
**Foliage:** Bright green • **Fall Color:** Rusty orange

**Morus** (Mulberry)

*MORUS alba 'Chaparral'* (Zone 3)  
**Chaparral Weeping Mulberry**

A gracefully weeping form with very attractive glossy foliage, that quickly falls to the ground. Drought tolerant. No fruit.



**Height:** 12' • **Spread:** 16' • **Shape:** Weeping  
**Foliage:** Bright green, glossy • **Fall Color:** Yellowish

**Nyssa sylvatica** (Black Gum)

*Nyssa sylvatica* (Zone 4)  
**Black Gum**

A dense, broadly pyramidal tree native to wet locations, but will do well in moderately dry soils. Glossy green leaves turn to shiny scarlet orange in fall.



**Height:** 40'-50' • **Spread:** 20'-30' • **Shape:** Broadly pyramidal  
**Foliage:** Glossy dark green • **Fall Color:** Scarlet orange

**Pinus** (Pine)

*Pinus nigra* (Zone 4)  
**Austrian Pine**

The darkest green of all the pines. Heavy, long needles. Vigorous, dense grower.

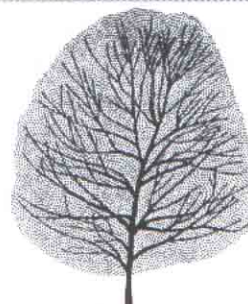


**Height:** 55' • **Spread:** 30' • **Shape:** Broadly pyramidal to rounded • **Foliage:** Dark green needles in pairs  
**Fall Color:** Evergreen

**Platanus** (Planetree)

*Platanus x acerifolia 'Bloodgood'* (Zone 5)  
**Bloodgood London Planetree**

Reputed to be more resistant to anthracnose than the species. The naturally shedding bark creates a dappled brown and cream pattern that accentuates sunlight filtering through the foliage. This is a popular tree for malls, parks and shopping centers.

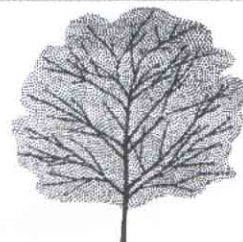


**Height:** 50' • **Spread:** 40' • **Shape:** Broadly pyramidal  
**Foliage:** Large, maple like, medium to dark • **Fall Color:** Yellow

**Prunus** (Flowering Cherry)

*Prunus subhirtella 'Autumnalis Rosea'* (Zone 5)  
**Autumn Flowering Cherry**

Very unusual for its bloom. Flowers are produced in November and again in the Spring. In mild climates it will bloom sporadically all Winter. It has a delicate branch pattern which adds to its winter interest.



**Height:** 25' • **Spread:** 22' • **Shape:** Upright spreading with slender branches • **Foliage:** Medium green • **Fall Color:** Yellow to bronze • **Flowers:** Semi-double to double, light pink

*Prunus sub. 'Autumnalis Rosea' / Prunus serrula* (Zone 4)  
**Autumn Flowering Cherry-Top Graft**

The Autumn Flowering Cherry with its bloom and delicate branch pattern high grafted onto a 6' std.



**Height:** 25' • **Spread:** 22' • **Shape:** Upright spreading with slender branches • **Foliage:** Medium green • **Fall Color:** Yellow to bronze • **Flowers:** Semi-double to double, light pink
