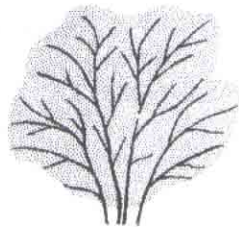


*Amelanchier grandiflora* 'Princess Diana' P.P. No. 6041  
**Princess Diana Serviceberry** (Zone 3)

A gracefully spreading small tree with excellent fall color. Fall foliage is spectacular, coloring early and lasting late in the season. Multi-stem.



**Height:** 20' **Spread:** 15' • **Shape:** Gracefully spreading  
**Foliage:** Small, green • **Fall Color:** Brilliant red  
**Flowers:** White, in clusters • **Fruit:** Edible, 3/8", purplish blue

*Amelanchier laevis* (Zone 4)  
**Allegheny Serviceberry**

This amelanchier has a more tree-like shape with a slightly taller and more upright form. Grown in single stem tree form and multi-stem.



**Height:** 25' **Spread:** 15' • **Shape:** Upright oval  
**Foliage:** Small, green • **Fall Color:** Orange • **Flowers:** White clusters • **Fruit:** 3/8", edible

*Amelanchier laevis*  
**Multi-Stem Allegheny Serviceberry**

*Amelanchier laevis* 'Cumulus' P.P. No. 3092 (Zone 4)  
**Cumulus Serviceberry**

A strong upright grower with clusters of white flowers in spring. Grown in tree form.



**Height:** 20'-30' **Spread:** 15'-20' • **Shape:** Oval Columnar  
**Foliage:** Dark green • **Flowers:** White • **Fruit:** Small red  
**Fall Color:** Orange to red

*Amelanchier laevis* 'Snowcloud' P.P. No. 7203 (Zone 4)  
**Snowcloud Serviceberry**

Foliage is tinted red in spring turning to dark green. Strong growing tree with upright growth pattern. Grown in tree form.



**Height:** 25' **Spread:** 15' • **Shape:** Upright oval  
**Foliage:** Dark green • **Fall Color:** Scarlet • **Flowers:** White  
**Fruit:** 3/8" purplish blue

**Betula** (Birch)

*Betula jacquemontii* (Zone 5)  
**Jacquemontii Birch**

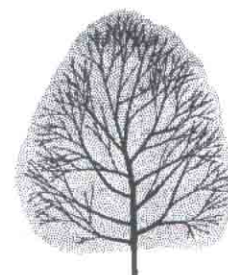
This tree has the whitest bark of all the birches. Thick leathery foliage shows some resistance to leaf miner. Available in both clump and single stem forms.



**Height:** 40' **Spread:** 30' • **Shape:** Upright oval  
**Foliage:** Dark green, thick, glossy • **Fall Color:** Yellow

*Betula nigra* (Zone 4)  
**River Birch**

The bark exfoliates to expose tan, pink or orange colored younger stems, which contrast beautifully with the white barked species.



**Height:** 40' **Spread:** 35' • **Shape:** Broadly pyramidal to rounded  
**Foliage:** Medium to dark green • **Fall Color:** Yellow to gold  
**Disease Resistance:** Resistant to Birch Borer

*Betula nigra* 'Cully' P.P. No. 4409 (Zone 4)  
**Heritage Birch**

A selection of River Birch chosen for its lighter colored bark and large, glossy, light green leaves. The peeling bark exposes mottled patches of cream, orange and pinkish tan colors. Grown both in clump and single stem tree form.



**Height:** 40' **Spread:** 30' • **Shape:** Broadly pyramidal  
**Foliage:** Light green, glossy • **Fall Color:** Yellow  
**Disease Resistance:** Good resistance to Bronze Birch Borer

*Betula pendula* 'Youngii' (Zone 2)  
**Young's Weeping Birch - Contorted**

This tree's characteristic asymmetric branch structure makes an interesting addition to small garden areas. Easily shaped.



**Height:** 15' **Spread:** 20' • **Shape:** Weeping • **Foliage:** Dark green • **Fall Color:** Yellow
